### What is Georgia Pathways to Coverage™?

In 2023, Georgia's Department of Community Health (DCH) launched Georgia Pathways to Coverage™, a Medicaid eligibility category that seeks to increase access to affordable, quality healthcare coverage for people who would not otherwise be eligible for traditional Medicaid.

To be eligible for Pathways, an applicant must:

- Be a Georgia resident
- Be a U.S. citizen or legally residing non-citizen
- Be between 19 and 64 years of age
- Have a household income of up to 100% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL). For example, in 2025, this equals:
  - \$15,650 per year or \$1,304 on average per month for one person
  - \$26,650 per year or \$2,220 on average per month for a family of three
- Complete at least 80 hours of qualifying activities per month
  - For Pathways applicants fulfilling the requirement through higher education, current college course-load credit hours will be granted qualifying activity hours as following:
    - At least 11.5 credit hours will count as 80 hours per month
    - Between 5.50 and 11.49 credit hours will count as 40 hours per month
    - Between 0.01 and 5.49 credit hours will count as 20 hours per month
- Not qualify for any other type of Medicaid
- Not be incarcerated

Qualifying activities include full-time or part-time employment, on-the-job training, job readiness assistance programs, community service, vocational educational training, enrollment in the Vocational Rehabilitation program of the Georgia Vocational Rehabilitation Agency (GVRA), and higher education through enrollment in public and private universities and technical colleges.

### How Does Pathways Benefit Your Organization?

As a trusted healthcare provider in Georgia, your organization is often the first point of contact for uninsured and underinsured individuals who may be eligible for Pathways. Pathways is a category of Medicaid coverage for many of the Georgians you treat. Helping uninsured Georgians apply for and get enrolled in Pathways would increase reimbursement on services you, as a provider, render to these currently uninsured individuals. We hope that by promoting this program and enrolling more Georgians in healthcare coverage, together we can increase access to affordable healthcare, and promote financial stability for hospitals, healthcare systems, and the state.

Georgia Pathways to Coverage™ is a pathway to Medicaid coverage and healthier communities! Pathways increases access to affordable, quality healthcare coverage for residents who are not otherwise eligible for traditional Medicaid.

To be eligible for Pathways, an applicant must:

- Be a Georgia resident

- Be between 19 and 64 years of age
- Have a household income of up to 100% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL). For example, in 2025, this equals:
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    - Between 5.50 and 11.49 credit hours will count as 40 hours per month
    - Between 0.01 and 5.49 credit hours will count as 20 hours per month
- Not qualify for any other type of Medicaid
- Not be incarcerated

- There are many ways to meet qualifying activity requirements for Pathways including full-time or part-time employment, on-the-job training, job readiness assistance programs, community service, vocational educational training, enrollment in the Vocational Rehabilitation program of the Georgia Vocational Rehabilitation Agency (GVRA), and higher education through enrollment in public and private universities and technical colleges.
